

# Safeguarding Policy Halfspace Academy – Safeguarding Policy

#### 1. Purpose

Halfspace Academy is committed to providing a safe, positive, and supportive environment where every child and young person can enjoy football, grow in confidence, and reach their potential.

#### 2. Scope

This policy applies to all Halfspace staff, coaches, volunteers, players, parents/carers, and visitors involved in our programmes, including training sessions, matches, events, and camps.

# 3. Key Principles

- The welfare of the child is paramount.
- All children have the right to equal protection from harm, abuse, or neglect.
- All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly.
- Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.

# 4. Safer Recruitment

- All staff and volunteers undergo Enhanced DBS checks.
- References are obtained and verified before appointment.
- Induction includes safeguarding, code of conduct, and emergency procedures.

# 5. Training

- All coaches complete FA Safeguarding Children training.
- Annual refresher training is mandatory.
- At least one staff member per session holds a valid **Emergency First Aid** certificate.

#### 6. Supervision

- Ratios follow FA guidelines (e.g., U7–U8: 1:8, U9–U18: 1:12).
- Players are always supervised until collected by a parent/carer.
- Persistent late collection is logged and followed up.

### 7. Reporting Concerns

- Concerns should be reported immediately to the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL).

- If a child is at immediate risk, call 999.

# 8. Photography & Media

- Parental consent is obtained for images/video.
- Media is used respectfully for coaching analysis and Halfspace communications only.

# 9. Anti-Bullying & Equality

- Halfspace has a zero-tolerance approach to bullying, harassment, and discrimination.
- Inclusion and respect are core values across all sessions.

This policy is reviewed **annually** or when legislation or FA guidance changes.
